## 2019 HIGHLIGHTS



january - february

UWHC received a \$60,000 gift from Tidelands Health to be used in partnership with Black River United Way to help with disaster preparedness, recovery and resiliency in Horry, Georgetown, and Williamsburg counties.

UWHC used our portion to refurbish and repair four homes devastated in the aftermath of Hurricane Florence.

The Community Champion Award was introduced. This award recognizes the giver in each campaign sector that has given the highest percentage change over the last year.

VITA was held where volunteers assisted 700 individuals with tax preparation at no cost, resulting in over \$350,000 in returned earned income credit and over \$808,000 in tax refunds.



Welcomed Blakely Roof as President and CEO to UWHC. Blakely serves as the 4th President and CEO in the 46 year history of United Way of Horry County.



The 26th Annual Day of Caring was held on October 18th. Over 300 volunteers worked on 14 different projects across Horry County. Tasks included landscaping, painting, playing games with seniors, and building a new drop-off box for donations

### **OUR INITIATIVES**

#### **Hurricane Disaster Relief**

Even though Horry County was spared from a hit from a major storm in 2019, there were still many residents dealing with the devastation from 2018's Hurricane Florence and flooding. In 2019, UWHC dispersed over \$109,000 in disaster relief funds by working in partnership with Catholic Charities, Samaritans Purse and other community partners to aid in repairing damaged homes and roofs, provide temporary living arrangements for those in need, help with post disaster clean up and fund crisis relief agencies. All efforts worked towards putting those Horry County residents affected back in safe, sanitary living conditions. Moving into 2020, there is still work to be done in areas of disaster cleanup and UWHC will continue to serve as a resource for those in need. All funds used in disaster relief were received from designated grants and contributions specific to this cause.

#### 211 Help Line

211 is a one-stop resource for finding assistance in Horry County. A database is kept of a wide variety of service providers including support groups, community clinics, counselors, shelters, food pantries, programs for seniors, and many more agencies in South Carolina. Call 2-1-1 anytime, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year to link to vital services in the community. You can also call 211 toll free at 1-866-892-9211. This service is free and is available in multiple languages.

#### Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Tax Preparation

Horry County residents who earn less than \$56,000 per year are eligible to participate in this program. Certified volunteers assist clients with their basic income tax return for free. They also let clients know if they qualify for special tax credits. In 2019, 700 individuals participated resulting in over \$808,000 in tax refunds.

#### Caring for Kindergartners - Feb 19

For the 16th year, United Way of Horry County partnered with Coastal Carolina University's Athletic Department. For this event, 85 student-athletes taught the importance of volunteerism to the youth of our community. They read "How Full is Your Bucket? For Kids" to kindergarten classrooms in Horry County. The student-athletes serve as mentors to the students. After the reading, the kindergartners write a note and draw a picture to be given to homebound seniors through our May Day bag program.

#### May Day Bags - May

During this event volunteers gathered at chamber of commerce buildings across Horry County to fill 1,000 bags with toiletries and small gifts to shut-in seniors in Horry County. Mobile Meals of the Grand Strand and Horry County Council on Aging delivered these bags to clients.

#### United to Learn - Fall & Spring

United to Learn was introduced into four Horry County District Schools in Fall 2017. The idea was created by the Board of Directors after realizing that Horry County had one of the lowest literacy scores in the state of South Carolina. The goal was to help with students in the bottom 20%. The majority of the students in the program don't get the one-on-one educational time at home which is critical to the student's success and improvement. This is where the volunteer steps in to provide the one-on-one time and a positive role model in the child's life. The connection between volunteer and student will grow and develop into a meaningful and connected relationship.

#### Day of Caring - Oct 18

United Way of Horry County's largest event involved over 300 volunteers working on 14 different projects across Horry County. Activities included building a drop-off shed, painting, landscaping, laying sod, playing games with seniors, dancing with special need clients, and creating a learning trail.

#### United to Read - Nov 7

90 volunteers gathered this year to read "Grace for President" to all 100 first grade classrooms in Horry County Schools. The theme of the book centered around the presidential election and having self confidence. This is a tri-county wide event that is partnered with Black River United Way.
