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2025 Grant Focus Areas – Bold Community Goals



Decrease the number of suicide ideations and attempts

Decrease the number of drugrelated overdose deaths Education

Increase the number of children who meet developmental milestones and enter kindergarten ready

Increase access to equitable learning opportunities and high-quality childcare for children and youth

Self-Sufficiency

Increase the number of Horry County residents meeting selfsufficiency standards Basic Needs

We envision a future where everyone has access to food, shelter, clothing, healthcare, basic materials, transportation, and a sense of security





2025 Competitive Grant

- Apply through the E-Cimpact database
- All applicant agencies must align with one bold community goal that BEST aligns with the program you're applying for. We will only fund agencies serving Horry County; all funds awarded must stay in Horry County.
- Annual grant through January 1, 2025 December 31, 2025
 - Disbursed monthly
- Operating, administrative, or program support
 - UWHC will consider grants between \$10,000 \$40,000, but we will only fund UP TO 30% of program expenses. Ask for what you need, but we will be looking for a healthy mix of funding
- October 28, 2024 Applications open
- November 8, 2024 All agencies will need to request access to the full application by filling out an eligibility form
- December 13, 2024 Applications close at 11:59pm





Organization financial requirements

- An applicant agency with total revenue of \$500,000 or greater will be required to have an audit performed by an independent audit firm.
- OAn agency with total revenue of \$499,999 or less will be required to complete the financial systems questionnaire to be signed off by the Board Chair and two other board members that the information is accurate.

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RBA and shared measurements – how it's going to look

EDUCATION GOAL

We seek to support and improve access to resources focusing on the physical, social, emotional, cognitive, and language development of children from birth through age 5, while also increasing the participation from their families and caregivers in their child's learning. We also seek to support and improve access to quality and equitable childcare, resources focusing on reading and language development, increased knowledge of math and science, and interest in life-long learning for children and youth.

Measureable Objectives

 Improve outcomes of and access to behavioral health services for children, youth, and adults

 Children, youth, and adults will utilize services that support the family and promote positive emotional, psychological, and social well-being





Community Game Plan – Education

Measurable Objectives

- Children start kindergarten developmentally on track
- Parents, caregivers, and/or guardians will utilize services that support the family and the success of their children
- Working families can afford childcare and can pursue positive enrichment opportunities for themselves and their children
- Children and youth will gain essential knowledge and skills





Community Game Plan - Self – Sufficiency

Measureable Objectives

 Increase the number of adults and families who engage in employment training and financial education

o Increase the number of financially sufficient adults and families

 Young people (ages 12-24) have access to, prepare for, and pursue career and financial development





Community Game Plan - Basic Needs

Measureable Objectives

- Removing Barriers people have access to services and resources that help stabilize crisis situations and remove barriers to meeting basic needs (i.e. necessary documentation)
- Food hunger and malnutrition are alleviated and prevented
- Healthcare people will have access to healthcare services and supports that contribute to overall improved health
- Housing people have access to emergency housing services (i.e. rent and utility assistance, emergency shelter, etc.)
- Basic Materials people will have access to basic hygiene, clothing, and/or other supplies
- Transportation people will have increased access to affordable transportation options and/or systems that provide reasonable, timely, effective access to transportation





RBA and shared measurements – how it's going to look

- Each agency is required to choose at least <u>one</u> measurable objective under the pillar of the bold community goal they are applying for
 - Under the chosen measurable objective, you must choose at least <u>one</u> performance measurement under each question
 - o How much did we do?
 - O How well did we do it?
 - Is anyone better off? Basic Needs measurable objectives (excluding healthcare) will not be required to measure a performance measure for this question
 - In addition to the required measures, you are welcome to create additional performance measurements as well
 - o **Please note: this is the second year shared performance measures are being implemented. They can be modified and adjusted over time. We welcome feedbacks they of Horry County United Way Horry, org





Tips

- All applications will be read and scored on a weighted evaluation rubric by our four vision councils: health, education, self-sufficiency, and basic needs
 - Comprised of issue area experts that have helped us put together our Community Game
 Plan, previous allocations volunteers, and UWHC Board of Directors
 - There will also be a finance vision council where all they will review is the financial documentation turned in
- Write your application as if the reader has no idea who your organization is or the services you provide
- Avoid acronyms and jargon the general public may not understand
- Maintain the "healthy mix" of funding guideline for the total program budget
- Do not request more than essential resources





What we will be looking for

- Alignment with at least one bold community goal outlined in the Community Game Plan
- Alignment with at least one measurable objective
- Need identification
- Volunteer involvement
- Fiscal strength
- Scale and scope
- Capacity/infrastructure for long-term sustainability





Timeline for 2025 Competitive Grant

- December 16 20, 2024 Completed applications will be sent to VC's to review
- For currently funded 2024 grantees: agency year-end reports are due on Friday, January 17, 2025 and these reports will be sent to the VCs on January 20, 2025 for review.
- <u>February 3 7, 2025–</u> VCs will meet to discuss the applications that were reviewed and scored (application scored based on preset scoring criteria) **If the finance vision council has questions about financials, we will schedule a virtual meeting with you to discuss**
- <u>February 10 28, 2025 VCs</u> will conduct <u>one-hour</u> in-person site visits of applicant agencies that have been reviewed. At the site visit, the VC's will have the opportunity to ask questions about your agency, program, application and/or your year-end report (the report will only apply to currently funded 2024 grantees).
- March 10 14, 2025 VCs will meet with the UWHC Allocations Chair to make final funding recommendations to be brought to the UWHC Board of Directors meeting for final approval
- End of March 2025 Agencies are notified of 2025 grant award
- April 2025 Agencies that are awarded funding will receive the first quarter's payment from January March and then will receive regular monthly allocation amounts for the rest of 2025
